He has worked in mixed veterinary practice for 8 years dealing primarily with cattle, sheep and companion animals. In 2014, he began completing a MSc in Food Regulatory Affairs with special interest in veterinary public health through the University of Ulster. The topic of his research project and basis for today's presentation 'Antibiotic resistance patterns of bacteria from dairy farm milk samples in Ireland'.



Gwen Rees qualified as a vet in 2009 in Liverpool and worked in mixed, rural practice in South Wales for a few years then moved to New Zealand to work as a dairy vet.
