Patrick Greene graduated with a bachelor of veterinary medicine from University College Dublin in 2009. He has worked in mixed veterinary practice for 8 years dealing primarily with cattle, sheep and companion animals. In 2014, he began completing a MSc in Food Regulatory Affairs with special interest in veterinary public health through the University of Ulster. The topic of his research project and basis for today's presentation 'Antibiotic resistance patterns of bacteria from dairy farm milk samples in Ireland'.

Gwen Rees qualified as a vet in 2009 in Liverpool and worked in mixed, rural practice in South Wales for a few years then moved to New Zealand to work as a dairy vet. On returning, Gwen took up a post as a Teaching Fellow in farm animal population medicine at the University of Bristol's School of Veterinary Sciences. In 2016 she moved into research and is currently completing a funded PhD aimed at understanding veterinary medicine use by UK dairy farmers within the context of antimicrobial resistance. Gwen sits on the editorial board for Veterinary Record Case Reports and represents the University of Bristol on the British Veterinary Association Welsh Branch Council.
