Guest Speaker Profile

Dr Siobhan Menzies BVM&S GP CERT(WVA&CPM) LfHom(Vet) MRCVS

Siobhan Menzies graduated from the Royal [Dick] School of Veterinary Studies in 1990. She studied homeopathy with the Faculty of Homeopathy, Physiotherapy at the Royal Vet College and in 2003 she studied Acupuncture with the Association of British Veterinary Acupuncturists eventually serving as a council member. Siobhan left general practice and established HolisticPet in order to provide complementary therapies for pets in NI. In 2007 Siobhan attended the Canine Rehabilitation Practitioner program provided by the University of Tennessee. Inspired by this course she opened the province's first dedicated pain management clinic with Earlswood vet referrals housing Northern Ireland's first underwater treadmill.



HolisticPet now offers veterinary led pain management clinics in eight veterinary clinics around the province. In June 2017 Siobhan obtained a GP Certificate in Western veterinary acupuncture and chronic pain management. In February 2018 Siobhan became the first vet on the island of Ireland to become an Emmett practitioner for animals. She is currently continuing her studies with the University of Tennessee Certified Canine Rehabilitation Practitioner Program which is the only university accredited course in this field.
